### **Bylaws**

As you may know, the District recently held a bylaws workshop, facilitated by Phyllis Ayers, VAPTA Bylaws Chairman and Debi Abadie, VAPTA Bylaws Co-chair.

The workshop was a success in many respects. Most important, twenty-five schools from all over Northern Virginia came to North Springfield Elementary School, did wonderful networking, and left with new respect and understanding of their units bylaws. Several participants felt that the workshop was so helpful, they suggested that the District offer it every year.

A number of important questions and points of clarification were made that would be useful for all units to know:

- Many units want to incorporate items into their bylaws which are better described as "standing rules." Standing rules are your procedures book covering items such as how motions can be made, how to deal with excessive board absences, etc. Standing rules are established by the executive board and can be changed at any time by the board. Bylaws, on the other hand, is the legal document of your association.
- Only the general membership can vote to make revisions or amendments to your bylaws. The executive board or executive committee does not have this authority.
- Thirty (30) days notice of proposed revisions or amendments must be given to your general membership. You do not have to give copies to all members. Instead consider posting them on a web site and providing the web address for viewing.

### **Other news...**
